Geographic Vulnerabilities

- Coastal storms
 - Wildfires
 - Nuclear plant
- 




Coastal Storms

- Greatest risk to HPN is wind damage.
 - Power outages likely
 - Potential for large scale evacuation is only likely in the event of a projected direct hit.
 - Normally will have 48 hours to evacuate
- 



Wildfires

- HPN exists in a fire dependent ecosystem.
 - Most local fuel has burned during the past several years.
 - Evacuation will have much less notice than with coastal storms
 - Traffic will be an issue.
 - Preparation and prevention is key
- 




Nuclear Plant

- Primary risk is radioactive release.
- Prevailing winds and sea breeze are our friends.
- Response is more likely to border on sheltering in place rather than evacuating.
- Preparation is critical for nuclear incidents.

Preparing in General

- Disaster supply kit
 - Go Bag or Ready Kit
 - Pre-planned meeting place
 - Pre-planned contact point
- 




Disaster Supply Kit

- Three-day supply of non-perishable food.
 - Three-day supply of water - one gallon of water per person, per day.
 - Portable, battery-powered radio or television and extra batteries.
 - Flashlight and extra batteries.
 - First aid kit and manual.
 - Sanitation and hygiene items (moist towelettes and toilet paper).
 - Matches and waterproof container.
 - Whistle.

Disaster Supply Kit

- Extra clothing.
 - Kitchen accessories and cooking utensils, including a can opener.
 - Photocopies of credit and identification cards.
 - Cash and coins.
 - Special needs items, such as prescription medications, eye glasses, contact lens solutions, and hearing aid batteries.
 - Other items to meet your unique family needs.
 - Don't forget the pets!

Go Bag or Ready Kit

- Copies of important documents
 - Medications
 - Important phone numbers
 - Cash!!
 - Contact lenses, glasses
 - Digital backups
 - Remember that you won't necessarily be home when disaster strikes.

The Six P's

- People and pets
 - Papers, phone numbers, important documents
 - Prescriptions, vitamins, eyeglasses
 - Pictures, irreplaceable memorabilia
 - Personal computers
 - Plastic— credit cards, ATM cards
- 



Evacuating

- You don't have to wait for us
 - Beat the traffic
 - Head to predetermined location if separated
 - Contact predetermined number if necessary

What Your PD Will be Doing

- Monitoring and coordinating
- Ordering and facilitating evacuation
- Reacting to special needs registry
- Providing information through Nixle, web, other outlets
- Maintaining security
- Coordinating Damage assessment
- Authorizing/coordinating repopulation
